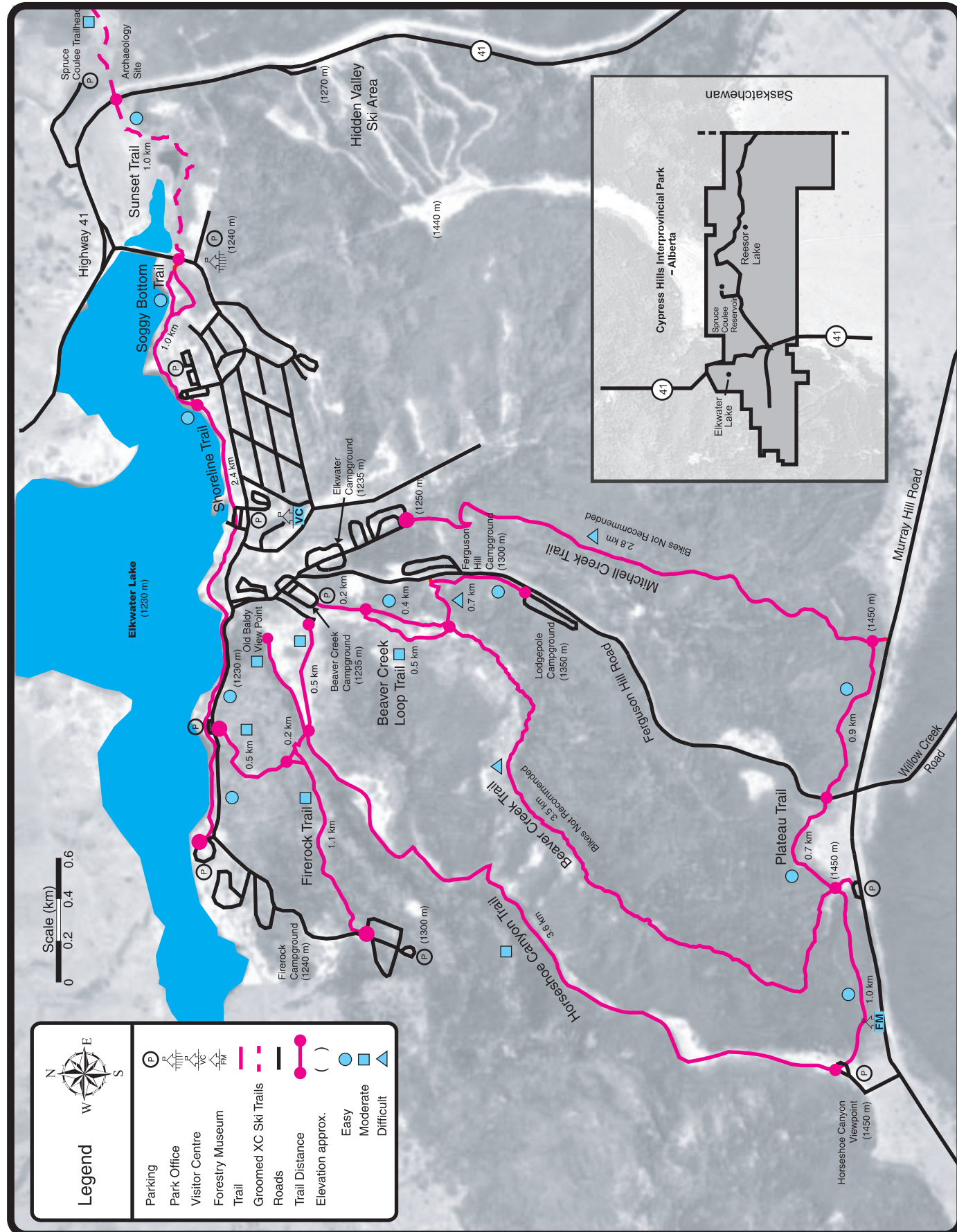

## Share the Trail

Trails in the Cypress Hills can be enjoyed year-round. The thousands of visitors that walk, bike, ski or snowshoe on Park trails illustrate this fact.

To enjoy your time on Park trails, please remember to:

**SHARE THE TRAIL** with others:

- Ride or ski under control at all times and reduce your speed on corners, narrow spaces, or when approaching pedestrians
- Kepp dogs on leash
- Snowshoe or walk beside cross country ski tracks
- All trails are designated as no-smoking areas

**PREPARE** for your trail adventure:

- Let others know of your travel plans, include estimated time of return
- Be prepared for changing weather conditions

**LEAVE NO TRACE** on Park trails:

- Pack out your litter
- Stay on designated trails
- Please do not pick plants
- Respect wildlife by not feeding, and watching from a distance. Report any unique sightings to Park Staff
